Regular and punctual attendance.

Assists urologists in the treatment of patients (3'0'' - 6'8'') height, 30-390 lbs) with renal and/or Ureteral calculi utilizing extracorporeal shockwave lithotripsy.

Perform diagnostic radiography and medical ultrasonography in clinical setting.

Operate and maintain the Medirex Tripter Compact and ultrasound unit provided.

Perform daily quality assurance and troubleshooting duties.

Provide and coordinate training of staff members for extracorporeal shock wave lithotripsy procedures.
